#### Penance & Reconciliation:

Monday-Thursday; Saturday: 7:30-7:50 AM Saturday afternoon: 4:00-4:30 PM

A Catholic is obliged to confess <u>serious sins</u> in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

**<u>Baptism</u>**: Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

#### Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. <u>Do not</u> wait until the sick person is unconscious.

#### **Matrimony:**

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest about a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

<u>Confirmation</u>: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

**<u>OCIA</u>: Desire baptism?** Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

"I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them."

Some years ago I read The Fourth Crusade and the Sack of Constantinople. It was a great history of the Sack of Constantinople given to me by a Greek priest, the father of my students. The author made it clear that no one, neither side, were fulfilling their Christian call. The Franks and Germans decided a 4ht crusade to go to Egypt and support the Christians there in their fight against the Arab Moslems. They never made it. They needed funding and supported the rightful heir of the throne of Constantinople who promised them money for the crusade when he would assume the throne. The Venetians supplied the ships and they headed to Constantinople. [On the way Venetians thought of themselves and raided a rival city state. Because it was under the rule of a crusader king, the whole crusade mission and Venetians were excommunicated. However, they went forward to Constantinople.] When the heir was enthroned, he taxed his new subjects, but they refused. So, the crusaders had to invade Constantinople or die waiting for the aid. When they invaded, the Greeks ran out of town donning their furs and jewels. Their mercenaries decided then to leave too. They were the hired men, and the Greek subjects were not their own. The Crusaders took the city and pillaged it and established a Latin Kingdom.

In life we can either be the good shepherds who care for and love the sheep or we can be the hired hands who work while it is "safe and profitable" abandoning them when danger comes. Jesus is the Good Shepherd for he loves us, his sheep and for our salvation he died on the cross. He took on our humanity and with it our sins. And when he rose, he promised us eternity and union with him. Through the centuries many have been appointed Shepherds for the Church (priests and bishops and popes and even secular leaders ) who either new their sheep as their own or only lead them as long as is profited them. Let's always pray for our leaders, ecclesial and civil, so that we are respected as their sheep. These "sheperds" are not to look at themselves as hired hands but rather as appointed by Christ to care and love the ones placed in their fold. In other words, be Christ to others.
