A Catholic is obliged to confess serious sins in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

Baptism: Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. Do not wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

Confirmation: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

RCIA: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

Do you not know that the unjust will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither fornicators nor idolaters nor adulterers nor boy prostitutes nor practicing homosexuals nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor robbers will inherit the kingdom of God. That is what some of you used to be; but now you have had yourselves washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God. (1 Cor 6:9-11)

Beware of Pride

This Sunday, on June 25 in the year of our Lord 2023, ten years short of the 2000th anniversary of our Lord's Resurrection, the parish of Our Lady of Grace in Hoboken will offer a Pride Mass. June, traditionally the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in the Catholic Church, has been declared Gay Pride Month by the secularist hedonistic demonic portion of our society. Unfortunately, many Catholics have opted to recognize Pride Month, even here in our own archdiocese.

This occasion has reminded me of St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians 6:9-10. The city of Corinth was known for its debauchery and incivility at the time of the Apostle. He warned them that the unrighteous/unjust would not inherit the kingdom of God. In the unexhaustive list of those who fail to live up to the Kingdom of Righteousness he includes:

Fornicators & adulterers – those who are engaged in intercourse before or outside of marriage;

Idolaters – those who worship the created rather than the Creator;

Malakoi – often left out of some English translations, it refers to effeminate and boys kept as prostitutes.

Sodomites, that is the self-abuser with other men, always understood to mean the ones engaged in homosexual acts; and

the thief, the greedy, the drunkard, the reviler, and the extortioner/robber.

Now does that mean these people cannot go to Heaven? No. All of us can repent of our sins, curb our immoral inclinations, change our lifestyles, and accept the Heart of Jesus into our own heart. This is conversion or metanoia - a transformative change of the heart. Our hearts must be conformed to Jesus' Sacred Heart, not the other way around. Jesus already took on a fleshy heart for our sake when by the Holy Spirit he was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. Yes! Jesus became like us so we could become like him. One with him in spirit and in body. We must put out our hand to Jesus as Peter did when sinking into the sea and say, "Lord, save me."

So, whether we are drunks, robbers, fornicators, homosexuals or in any way of life contrary to good morals and righteous living, we must ask the Lord to save us. God loves us truly, therefore he is not a permissive parent. He calls us to holiness, and that means rejecting a sinful way of life and living soberly, chastely and with honesty, aka heroic virtue must be our goal. Jesus made that clear when he told the woman caught in adultery, "Neither do I condemn you. Go and sin no more." Jesus was not speaking of sinless perfection. He was warning against a return to sinful lifestyle choices. His words both extended mercy and demanded holiness. Jesus is always the perfect balance of "grace and truth" (John 1:14).

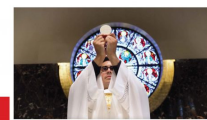

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart, in recognition of Jesus' apparitions starting in 1673 to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a member of the Visitation Sisters, through whom He asked for devotion to His Sacred Heart¹. The Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a moveable feast, but it most often takes place in June, and thus June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart. Pope Benedict XVI urged Catholics "to renew, in this month of June, their devotion to the Heart of Jesus".
