A Catholic is obliged to confess serious sins in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

Baptism: Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. Do not wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest about a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

Confirmation: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

RCIA: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

St. Peter Claver

Patron Saint of African missions.

St. Peter Claver was born at Verdu, Catalonia, Spain in 1580. He entered the Jesuit college of Barcelona, becoming a Jesuit novitiate, taking his final vows on Aug 8, 1604. St. Peter Claver left his homeland to become a missionary in the colonies of the new world. He ministered to the slaves arriving daily in Cartagena (now Columbia). Over a thousand slaves arrived in Cartagena every month. He brought them food, ministered to their medical needs and prayed with them. He followed them to the plantation they were taken to. St. Peter Claver declared himself to be the "slave of the Negroes forever."

After instructing them in the faith, he baptized them. By 1651 he had baptized over 300,000 slaves into the faith. After suffering from illness for four years, St. Peter Claver died on Sept. 8, 1654. St. Peter Claver has been declared the patron saint of African Missions.

What is happening to our country? A few years ago, Antifa/BLM protests and riots disrupted the peace. Neighborhoods taken over by thugs. Police were shooting people in the back.

I recently witnessed the video of a man being shot by a police officer seven times in the back as he was being held back by his tee shirt. The policeman fired his pistol while the victim's children witness this horror from inside the car. He survived but was paralyzed.

I just read about a citizen of Georgia who was shot in the face by a state trooper. He is now dead. This got little attention since it was not caught on video.

And do you remember George Floyd who died while an officer knelt on his neck? Riots and protests broke out. The riots only hurt innocent people and businesses, and soon had little to do with justice for Mr. Floyd. Why this violence? Why this needless death? Do we really need heated racial tensions?

I am one who is inclined to give the police officer the benefit of the doubt. But after all these incidents it makes me wonder and reconsider my deference. St. Louis was the king of France and in his instruction he tells his son, heir to the throne, that as a king he must defer to the poor: *And if a poor man has a quarrel with a rich man, sustain the poor rather than the rich, until the truth is made clear, and when you know the truth, do justice to them.*



Yes, when people have power, money, influence, authority they can more easily want their power felt. This is the temptation. Christ said, "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God" (Mt 19:24). When we have these things, we can be tempted to think that they are ours when in fact they were given to us by God, not for our self-aggrandizement but for the good of our neighbor (common good). Remember: Love your neighbor as yourself. The feudal system may have had its drawbacks, but it taught one important thing: the lord of the manor was responsible for the wellbeing of the people. He had to provide protection, support the church, and govern for their sake.

Today we live in a society that knows not God. Too many people either give God outward honor while having an empty heart or have altogether forsaken any belief in a loving merciful God. So we have a society bent on creating mores, laws and ethics that are not based on divine law (revelation) but on human acumen, and we know how flawed that is. From the beginning when God created us with free will, we have been exercising it as if God does not see or hear us. From the beginning of the Enlightenment period, man has decided that we can do it all without reference to God or the natural law. This secular humanism is doomed and we can see its results when a man who has chosen to protect the public can shoot someone 7 times in the back, or when a mob is allowed by elected officials to ransack a city or when Catholic politicians can say that killing an unborn child is a right. We are drifting so far from God that we are now losing the grace of his protection from all evil. My brothers and sisters, we as a community of believers have to live a Christian life and double down in our prayers and our efforts to bring Christ to others before our nation totally unravels. We say in the pledge of allegiance, "one nation under God." Let's keep it that way.

**ADDICTION TREATMENT REFERRAL PROGRAM
for persons suffering from acute addiction**

Within 48 hours of receipt of referral, NJRC will provide linkage to and commencement of addiction treatment services to referred persons. These services will include but are not limited to linkages for intake, the creation of a personalized long-term treatment plan, detoxification, ambulatory withdrawal management, induction on Suboxone or buprenorphine or the initiation of Vivitrol, residential treatment, intensive outpatient treatment, and/or induction of Medication Assisted Treatment, as needed and appropriate. Where appropriate, court-involved persons and justice-involved veterans will also be enrolled and referred to NJRC's Orientation and additional wrap-around services, including job training and employment, mental health and medical care, transportation, and license restoration services.

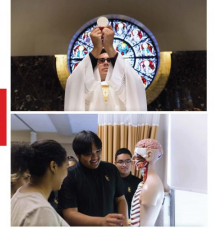

In canonizing Anthony in 1232, Pope Gregory IX spoke of him as the "Ark of the Testament" and the "Repository of Holy Scripture." That explains why St. Anthony is frequently pictured with a book of the Scriptures in his hands. In 1946 Pope Pius XII officially declared Anthony a Doctor of the Universal Church. It is in Anthony's love of the word of God and his prayerful efforts to understand and apply it to the situations of everyday life that the Church especially wants us to imitate St. Anthony. While noting in the prayer of his feast Anthony's effectiveness as an intercessor, the Church wants us to learn from Anthony, the teacher, the meaning of true wisdom and what it means to become like Jesus, who humbled and emptied himself for our sakes and went about doing good.

2024 Mass Book Opens September 11

You are welcome to book Masses for the Calendar year 2024 beginning Monday, September 11, at 9:00 am. In order for all the members of our Parish to have a chance to have Masses offered for their loved ones, each person will be able to book only three (3) Masses until October 7.

Beginning Tuesday, October 10, the Mass Book will be open for additional requests. As permitted by the Code of Canon Law, there will be a "Corporate Mass" offered on the first Saturday of each month at 5:30 pm. There will be multiple intentions for that Mass during which each name will be read. The priest who offers the Mass may receive only one stipend. The other stipends will be used for support of missionary and visiting clergy. Masses may be offered for the living or the deceased.
