A Catholic is obliged to confess <u>serious sins</u> in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

<u>**Baptism:**</u> Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. <u>Do not</u> wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest about a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

<u>Confirmation</u>: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

<u>RCIA</u>: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

If he cries out to me, I will hear him; for I am compassionate (Exodus 22:26).

From the *Book of Exodus* we hear God's own words: I am compassionate. Compassion comes from the Latin *cum passio* meaning suffer with. Yes! God suffers with us. While Muslim extremists slaughter thousands of our Catholic brothers and sisters, God's own children, God is with them and suffers with them. Imagine for a moment the day that our God judges those vile murderers.

When a child is molested, God is in the midst of it. God feels what we feel, knows what we know, experiences what we experience. He is compassion. Further the Book of Exodus shows us this: If ever you wrong [children and aliens] and they cry out to me, I will surely hear their cry. My wrath will flare up, and I will kill you with the sword; then your own wives will be widows, and your children orphans.

Sometimes we expect God to stop the evil one, but he doesn't. This is one of those mysteries: Why does God allow evil? If God is Love and all Good, then why is there hatred and evil? In the beginning God created the universe and on earth he created the animals and finally human beings. Yet man and the animals are different. Animals were created directly from the earth. But upon creating Adam out of the earth, he also breathed into him the spirit of life, and man became a living being created in the image and likeness of God. Unlike the animals, Man was capable of loving and adoring God which requires freedom. We cannot love someone if we are not free to love or hate, to nurture or neglect, protect life or murder, etc. We were given free will precisely because we are human and called to love. As Christ said that the greatest commandment is to love the Lord, our God, with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our mind, and that the second is like it, to love our neighbor as ourselves.

The conundrum is real. If God were to intervene and stop men from doing evil, then he would have to intervene and force him to love. Evil happens when there is an absence of love and respect. But love by its nature is an act of the will and cannot be forced. God will not force us to love and so evil happens, not from God's willing it but from man's weaknesses and/or unwillingness to love - to be holy (perfect) as God is holy (perfect).

So my brothers and sisters, until we, each one of us, will to love, i.e. to be holy, evil will come from our heart. Christ himself said: From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile (Mark 7:21-23). We are called to unite our will with Christ's. Remember the Lord's Prayer: thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. God is compassion. He is with us always: in our joys and in our woes, in our suffering and in our glory, in our life and in our death.




Celebrate Ecumenical Taizé Prayer Service
