Penance & Reconciliation:

Monday-Thursday; Saturday: 7:30-7:50 AM
Saturday afternoon: 4:00-4:30 PM
A Catholic is obliged to confess serious sins in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

Baptism: Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. Do not wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest about a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

Confirmation: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

RCIA: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

Rejoice! Gaudate! Rejoice!

Today is what traditionally is called Gaudate Sunday, which means rejoice.

For the past couple of weeks the readings have told us to be alert, be ready for the second coming of Jesus. We were called to repent, to change our hearts of stone into human hearts. Just like preparing to receive the Eucharist, which is the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ himself, we have to be prepared to receive Him when He comes again to judge us, and if we are not found fit for the Kingdom he will give us our just reward. This nevertheless creates a certain amount of anxiety and fear, and so we take some time to focus on the joyful aspect of Christ's coming among us a second time.

Do you remember when you were a child and Christmas was coming nearer & nearer? Can you recall the excitement and anticipation you had about the coming of Santa? Remember the bit of anxiety you might have had because Santa was making a list and checking it twice to find out if you've been naughty or nice? And what if Santa brought you coal, what would you do?

Well this same kind of joy, excitement, anticipation and even anxiety should be what we feel before we receive Christ in the Eucharist, and as we await the Coming of Jesus not only at Christmas but also in his Second Coming.

So let's rejoice heartily like Isaiah when God anointed him, thus enlightening him to know God's word and follow it, and with the same joy the Blessed Virgin proclaimed to her cousin Elizabeth that God had chosen her to be his mother. Let's show that same joy towards our family and friends and even enemies that God has called us, all of us, to be his children and to be with him for all eternity.

St. Peter Canisius, feast day December 21

St. Peter Canisius, (born May 8, 1521, the Netherlands—died December 21, 1597 in Switzerland; canonized 1925), doctor of the Church, Jesuit scholar, and strong opponent of Protestantism. He has been called the second apostle of Germany for his ardent defense of Roman Catholicism there.

Perhaps more than any of his contemporaries, Canisius delayed the advance of Protestantism by his participation in the religious discussions at Worms (1557) and at the Council of Trent and the Diet of Augsburg (1559). He sought to renew the Roman Catholic Church in Germany by means of his friendship with the Holy Roman emperor and numerous magnates, by his zealous preaching in various German towns, by the extension of the Jesuit order, and especially by his desire to provide worthy and scholarly priests. His German missions won him fast friendships with persons in all walks of life, including the emperor. He did important work in southern Germany and Austria, Bohemia, and Switzerland, where in 1580 he settled in Fribourg and founded a Jesuit college (now the University of Fribourg).

His major work was the Triple Catechism (1555–58), containing a lucid exposition of Roman Catholic dogma. It became the most famous catechism of the Counter-Reformation, going through 400 editions in 150 years.

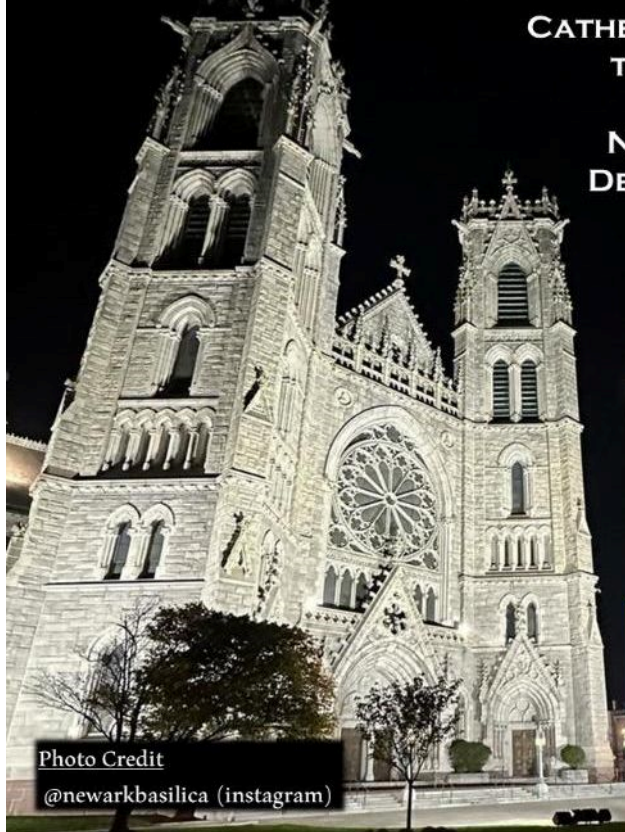

ADDICTION TREATMENT REFERRAL PROGRAM for persons suffering from acute addiction

Within 48 hours of receipt of referral, NJRC will provide linkage to and commencement of addiction treatment services to referred persons. These services will include but are not limited to linkages for intake, the creation of a personalized long-term treatment plan, detoxification, ambulatory withdrawal management, induction on Suboxone or buprenorphine or the initiation of Vivitrol, residential treatment, intensive outpatient treatment, and/or induction of Medication Assisted Treatment, as needed and appropriate. Where appropriate, court-involved persons and justice-involved veterans will also be enrolled and referred to NJRC's Orientation and additional wrap-around services, including job training and employment, mental health and medical care, transportation, and license restoration services.
