A Catholic is obliged to confess <u>serious sins</u> in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

<u>Baptism</u>: Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. <u>Do not</u> wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

Confirmation: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

<u>RCIA</u>: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved. (Luke 10:9)

I remember these words of Jesus very clearly now. Many years ago, while I was at Our Lady of Lourdes, I preached up a storm. I told the people that to be saved we must believe in Jesus. That when we die, we will all be judged by Jesus who is the Gate into heaven, eternal life. Regardless of being a Christian, Jew, Muslim, Hindu or even a None, we must all be seated before the Judge. There is no other way into heaven.

You see by divine revelation we know heaven not to be a place or location, but rather an existence. That is to be in heaven means to be in the eternal presence of the One who loves us most, God. And since there is only One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, there is only one Judge.

A parishioner was upset with my words which implied that since only 1/3 of the world believes in Jesus, then the other 2/3 must be going to hell. "Not at all," was my response. Jesus is the judge, and all will be judged by Him, the one who died for us on the cross. "But they don't believe in Jesus," he retorted. "But," I replied, "if you believe and know Jesus to be Lord and God, then you have to believe and know that Jesus judges everyone, from the believer to the atheist, even if that person doesn't believe in God. Otherwise, your confession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and God, is a relativism. How can you say, 'Jesus is God and then say he is not the Judge of the living and the dead?""

Jesus is the Gateway into eternal Life. We cannot, that is, no one can enter Eternal Life without Jesus opening the gate. How Jesus judges a Jew or a Muslim or a None, is not for us to say. Be we can say with all confidence that Jesus is a merciful judge whose love goes beyond all telling. Just look at the cross and you will see all truth.

From the Jerusalem Catecheses

(Cat. 22, Mystagogica 4, 1. 3-6. 9: PG 33, 1098-1106)

The bread of heaven and the cup of salvation

On the night he was betrayed our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples and said: "Take, eat: this is my body." He took the cup, gave thanks and said: "Take, drink: this is my blood." Since Christ himself has declared the bread to be his body, who can have any further doubt? Since he himself has said quite categorically, This is my blood, who would dare to question it and say that it is not his blood?

Therefore, it is with complete assurance that we receive the bread and wine as the body and blood of Christ. His body is given to us under the symbol of bread, and his blood is given to us under the symbol of wine, in order to make us by receiving them one body and blood with him. Having his body and blood in our members, we become bearers of Christ and sharers, as Saint Peter says, in the divine nature.

Once, when speaking to the Jews, Christ said: Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood you shall have no life in you. This horrified them and they left him. Not understanding his words in a spiritual way, they thought the Savior wished them to practice cannibalism.

Under the old covenant there was showbread, but it came to an end with the old dispensation to which it belonged. Under the new covenant there is bread from heaven and the cup of salvation. These sanctify both soul and body, the bread being adapted to the sanctification of the body, the Word, to the sanctification of the soul.

Do not, then, regard the eucharistic elements as ordinary bread and wine: they are in fact the body and blood of the Lord, as he himself has declared. Whatever your senses may tell you, be strong in faith.

You have been taught and you are firmly convinced that what looks and tastes like bread and wine is not bread and wine but the body and the blood of Christ. You know also how David referred to this long ago when he sang: Bread gives strength to man's heart and makes his face shine with the oil of gladness. Strengthen your heart, then, by receiving this bread as spiritual bread, and bring joy to the face of your soul.

May purity of conscience remove the veil from the face of your soul so that by contemplating the glory of the Lord, as in a mirror, you may be transformed from glory to glory in Christ Jesus our Lord. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen
