SACRAMENTS

Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

Saturday (anticipated): 5:30 PM Sunday: 8:00 AM; 10:30 AM; 12:00PM Monday-Saturday: 8:00 AM Holy Days of Obligation: see inside

Penance & Reconciliation:

Monday-Thursday; Saturday: 7:30-7:50 AM Saturday afternoon: 4:00-4:50 PM

A Catholic is obliged to confess <u>serious sins</u> in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

<u>Baptism</u>: Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. <u>Do not</u> wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest about a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

<u>Confirmation</u>: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

<u>RCIA</u>: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

Nearly 3000 lives were taken by the evil designs of anti- American and anti -Christian forces of al-Qaeda led by the infamous Osama bin Laden.

That was a sunny Tuesday morning. I was a vicar at Our Lady of Lourdes in Mountainside at the time. Usually by day off was Tuesday, but that week my mother was visiting from Florida, and I had to take off Monday and bring her to the airport for her return. So, this Tuesday in question I was chatting with the ladies who were setting up Bingo. They said that a plane crashed into Rockefeller Center. Not too excited about the sad news, I meandered over to the rectory to see the bad news. The images are forever burned in my memory. To this day I cannot watch reruns of the footage. I feared many in my parish would have been killed – praise God no one was.

I remember many people flying flags and waving signs: God Bless America. The church was filled that following weekend; something I hadn't seen since I was a boy. A month later we had a prayer service for the deceased. We paid close attention to those family members of parishioners who had died that day.

As time passed the God Bless America signs were lowered and soon the USA was in a military action in Afghanistan to destroy al-Qaeda and capture bin Laden. It took almost a decade, but bin Laden was found and executed.

As a Christian I began to pray for America daily. This horror woke me up to the fact that the US is in danger both from within and from outside forces who out of envy or ideological extremism want an end to US. So, I went to our Perpetual Adoration Chapel and prayed the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Since September 11, 2001, I have not ceased begging God to have mercy on US.

Therefore, while it is kind to have a memorial service for the deceased or sing a patriotic hymn which serve to remind us of what had happened, it is fundamental to implore God's protection and place ourselves at his will. Truly may God bless the USA as we give him honor each day.

ADDICTION TREATMENT REFERRAL PROGRAM for persons suffering from acute addiction

Within 48 hours of receipt of referral, NJRC will provide linkage to and commencement of addiction treatment services to referred persons. These services will include but are not limited to linkages for intake, the creation of a personalized long-term treatment plan, detoxification, ambulatory withdrawal management, induction on Suboxone or buprenorphine or the initiation of Vivitrol, residential treatment, intensive outpatient treatment, and/or induction of Medication Assisted Treatment, as needed and appropriate. Where appropriate, court-involved persons and justice-involved veterans will also be enrolled and referred to NJRC's Orientation and additional wrap-around services, including job training and employment, mental health and medical care, transportation, and license restoration services.


Qualified Charitable Distributions

2024 Mass Book Opens September 11

You are welcome to book Masses for the Calendar year 2024 beginning Monday, September 11, at 9:00 am. In order for all the members of our Parish to have a chance to have Masses offered for their loved ones, each person will be able to book only three (3) Masses until October 7.

Beginning Tuesday, October 10, the Mass Book will be open for additional requests. As permitted by the Code of Canon Law, there will be a "Corporate Mass" offered on the first Saturday of each month at 5:30 pm. There will be multiple intentions for that Mass during which each name will be read. The priest who offers the Mass may receive only one stipend. The other stipends will be used for support of missionary and visiting clergy. Masses may be offered for the living or the deceased.


