A Catholic is obliged to confess <u>serious sins</u> in kind and number to a priest. If one is conscious of having committed serious sin, Confession ought to be made before receiving the Eucharist.

<u>Baptism:</u> Please call to arrange for your child's baptism before or soon after birth. A Godparent must be a Catholic in good standing.

Anointing of the Sick:

Please call for a priest to celebrate this Sacrament of Healing and Forgiveness for someone who is seriously ill or in danger of death. <u>Do not</u> wait until the sick person is unconscious.

Matrimony:

All Catholics ought to seek to have their marriage blessed by the Church so as to live in God's good graces & receive the Eucharist. Marriage cannot validly exist between baptized persons unless it is also a sacrament (Canon 1055.2). Contact a priest about a year prior to the intended date of marriage to ensure proper preparation.

<u>Confirmation</u>: Need to complete your Sacraments of Initiation? Call Mrs. Kachnowski at 908-245-6572. She will help you prepare for confirmation. If they can do so without serious inconvenience, Catholics ought to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation before being admitted to marriage (Canon 1065).

RCIA: Desire baptism? Called to be a Catholic Christian? Contact Deacon David at 908-245-6572 and he will help you discern God's call to holiness.

"Which of the two did his father's will?"

When I was sixteen years old I talked to my father like an adult. He was in the habit of barking out orders: Do this and do that! I dreaded Sunday's because that seemed to be yard work chores and Saturday mornings weren't much better – that's when mom had us clean house. At sixteen my father was yelling at me to get something done. I looked straight at him and said, "All you have to do is ask. You don't have to yell all the time." He looked at me in a very pensive way. And from that time on I did as he asked and he never barked an order at me again.

In the Gospel Jesus uses a parable to explain that God calls us to do something. And as his faithful sons and daughters we must responds to his "orders". We need to be obedient and we must do what he asks, not what we want. The first son in today's Gospel said, "No," but realizing his disobedience and his filial duty, he did what his father asked. The second however, said, "Yes," but then chose to do what he wanted in complete disobedience and disregard for his duty to be a good son. The first repented but the second turned away.

In our own relationship with God, we need too realize two things. One, we are sinners and often we disobey God or choose our own will, but we can all turn away from sin and become God's true sons and daughters. Two, we are not to give lip service to God. We must do as we believe realizing the grace that God has given to us is for the enrichment of our soul and the building up of the Church. So let us be good sons and daughters and mean yes when we say yes to God and no when we mean no to all that leads us away from God.

Ethics Point

ADDICTION TREATMENT REFERRAL PROGRAM for persons suffering from acute addiction

Within 48 hours of receipt of referral, NJRC will provide linkage to and commencement of addiction treatment services to referred persons. These services will include but are not limited to linkages for intake, the creation of a personalized long-term treatment plan, detoxification, ambulatory withdrawal management, induction on Suboxone or buprenorphine or the initiation of Vivitrol, residential treatment, intensive outpatient treatment, and/or induction of Medication Assisted Treatment, as needed and appropriate. Where appropriate, court-involved persons and justice-involved veterans will also be enrolled and referred to NJRC's Orientation and additional wrap-around services, including job training and employment, mental health and medical care, transportation, and license restoration services.

For example, if you are taking a \$1,000 distribution and you wish to make a \$500 donation, and you are in the 20% tax bracket, your tax liability will be reduced by \$100. 


